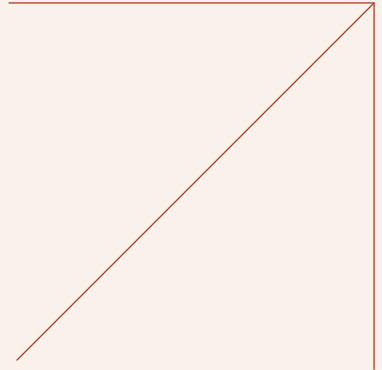

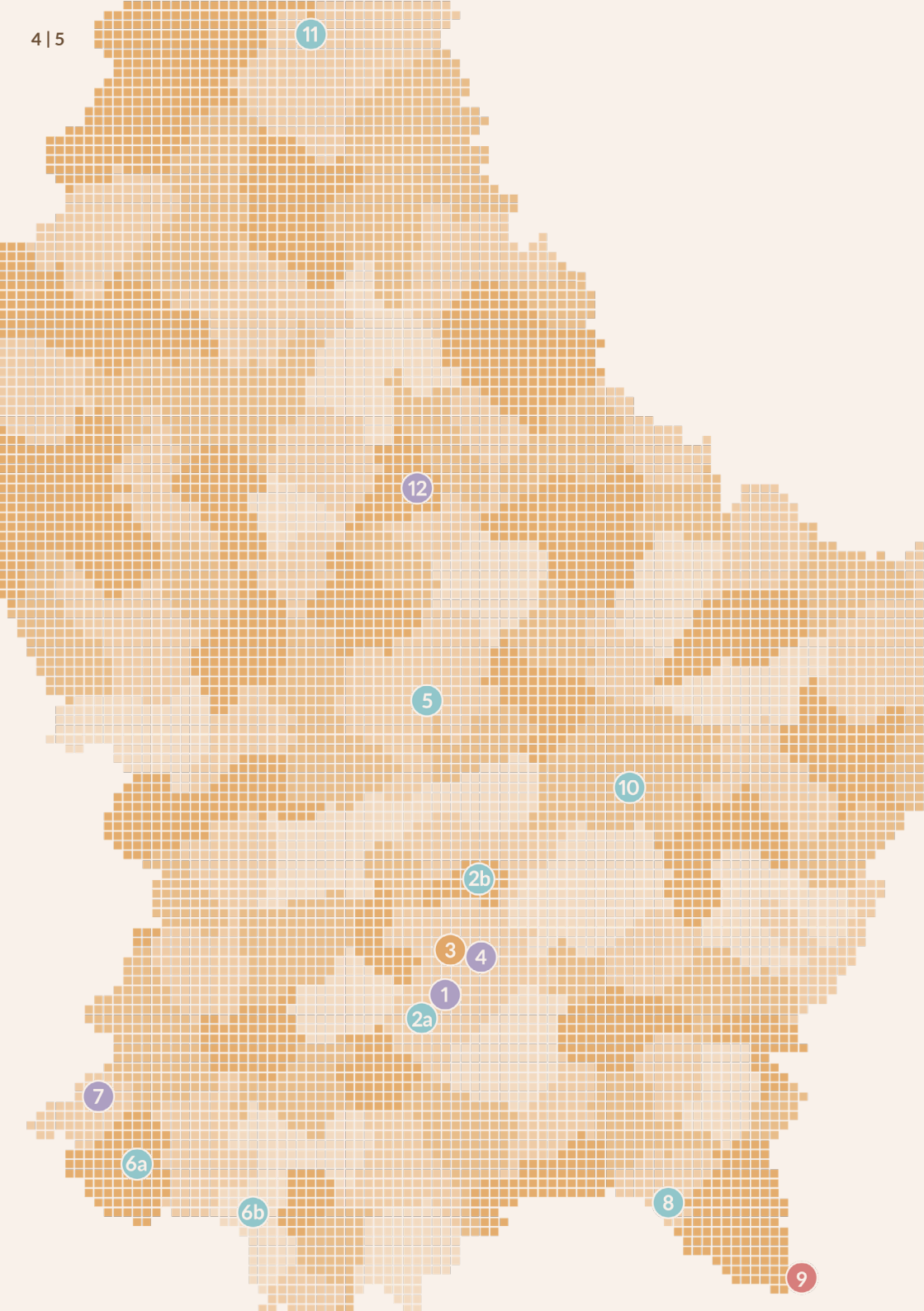

International schools – An overview

Public international school offer in Luxembourg: programmes and qualifications

In Luxembourg, the public international school offer is characterised by its strong diversity and allows students to choose from several internationally recognised learning pathways. These programmes follow different educational approaches and lead to diplomas that open access to universities and international career opportunities.

Public European schools

A countrywide offer

All public European Schools in Luxembourg provide primary education and a complete secondary school track.

Teaching is multilingual. Each public European school offers three language sections: French, German, and English. Some schools also offer preparatory classes (voie de preparation), that adapt language pathways to the national curriculum. Accredited European Schools also provide classes for newly arrived pupils who already have proficiency in German, English, French, Italian, Spanish or Portuguese. These pupils follow classes in the language they already master and attend intensive courses in German, English or French with the aim of integrating them into an existing language section.

Diploma

The European Baccalaureate is awarded by the European Schools. It is recognized as equivalent to national secondary school leaving diplomas and provides access to universities and other higher education institutions in all European Union countries as well as in many other countries.

Language requirements

To enrol in the first year of secondary school (S1), the pupil must have a good command of at least two of the following languages: French, German or English. Depending on your child's first language (L1), teaching takes place in a French, English or German language section.

It is also possible to join a SWALS section (Students Without a Language Section) when available. In this case, the pupil must have good skills in Spanish, Italian or Portuguese, and basic knowledge (A2 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) in a second language among French, German or English.

In a SWALS section, pupils follow language classes in their first language, while all non-language subjects are taught in the second language.



Programme

Public European schools in Luxembourg follow the European Schools curriculum and prepare pupils for the European Baccalaureate.

They place strong emphasis on multicultural learning. In the three language sections (English-speaking, French-speaking and German-speaking), pupils are taught in their dominant language (L1), whether this is English, French or German. A second language (L2, taught at the first foreign language level) - chosen from French, German or English - is introduced in the first year of primary school. From the first year of secondary school, a third language (L3) is added, and a fourth language (L4) can be chosen from S4 onwards. Pupils can even choose an optional fifth language (L5) in S6. Pupils also learn Luxembourgish from the first year of primary school until S3.

The secondary cycle leading to the European Baccalaureate, lasts seven years and is organised into three stages:

- Observation cycle (S1 à S3),
- Pre-orientation cycle (S4 à S5),
- Orientation cycle (S6 à S7).

The different language options offered in secondary education at European public schools

Programme offered in English and French

Pupils can follow the IB curriculum in French in three secondary schools, while one school offers the IB in English. After completing primary school, pupils begin with preparatory classes before entering the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, designed for students aged 16 to 19.

In addition to the full range of core subjects, the pupils choose their study topics from six subject groups: mathematics; sciences; language acquisition; studies in language and literature; individuals and societies; arts.

The conformity of the curricula taught is monitored regularly by the *International Baccalaureate Organisation (IBO)*.

Diploma

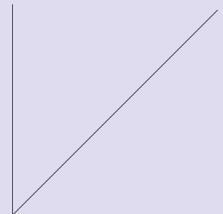
The International Baccalaureate (IB) is recognised across Europe and worldwide. It grants access to higher education in many countries and prepares students to continue their studies at universities internationally.

Language requirements

As teaching is provided in French or English, pupils must have a good command of the language of instruction.

All international secondary education programmes also include the learning of Luxembourgish, which is compulsory until the third year of secondary school.

Cambridge Assessment International Education

An international offer with English as language of instruction and courses in other languages

The Cambridge Assessment International Education is offered from the first year of primary school (Primary Stage 1) until the end of secondary school (1^{re} IEC). The major subjects are taught according to the Cambridge curriculum.

The public English-language school offering the Cambridge Assessment International Education:

→ International School Michel Lucius (LML)

Diploma

This pathway leads to internationally recognised British qualifications: the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) around age 16, followed by the Advanced Subsidiary Level (AS-levels) and the Advanced Level (A-levels) around age 18.

A-levels mark the completion of secondary education and give access to higher education in many countries. These qualifications are widely accepted by universities worldwide, and particularly by universities in English-speaking countries.

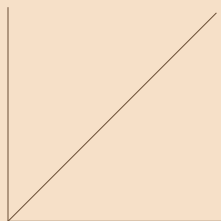
Language requirements

The language of instruction is English, with required, adapted and flexible language courses in French, German and Luxembourgish. This pathway is suitable for pupils having a good command of English at the time of enrolment.



Programme

From 4th IEC (equivalent to a 4^e class in the Luxembourgish system), the pupils begin to shape their learning path with the guidance from the teaching staff. Pupils choose their elective subjects and the subjects in which they wish being examined, based on their strengths and goals. The programmes, which are regularly validated and monitored by Cambridge Assessment International Education, are built on an innovative and collaborative approach to teaching, encouraging the development of critical thinking and creativity.

German-Luxembourgish education

A unique offer

The school welcomes pupils from across the Greater Region, providing a multilingual and multicultural environment. Learning combines components of both the Luxembourgish and German school systems.

The German-Luxembourgish education program is offered by the Schengen-Lyzeum Perl from Grade 5 (equivalent to Cycle 4.1 of the Luxembourgish primary school) to Grade 13.

The German-Luxembourgish public school offering this curriculum:

→ Deutsch-Luxemburgisches Schengen-Lyzeum (SLP)

Diploma

At the end of Grade 13, students receive two diplomas recognized in both countries: the Abitur (Allgemeine Hochschulreife) and the Luxembourgish secondary school leaving diploma. Both diplomas provide access to higher education in Germany, Luxembourg, and many other countries.





Language requirements

To follow the German–Luxembourgish curriculum, pupils must have a very strong command of German, as it is the main language of instruction.

Below is a table showing how languages are learned within the Schengen-Lyzeum Perl.

Programme

This German-Luxembourgish education program combines elements of the school systems of both countries. In addition to German, which is the language of instruction, French, English, and Luxembourgish are also taught at the Schengen-Lyzeum Perl. At the end of lower secondary education (Sekundarstufe 1), students are either directed to the *Gymnasiale Oberstufe Saar (GOS)*, the equivalent of the classical secondary education track, or to the Business/*Wirtschaft* branch, the equivalent of general secondary education with an administrative and commercial focus.

Luxembourg schools also offer adults the possibility to take the *Diplôme d'accès aux études supérieures* (DAES), which is equivalent to the Luxembourgish secondary school leaving diploma (*Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires*) and gives access to higher education.

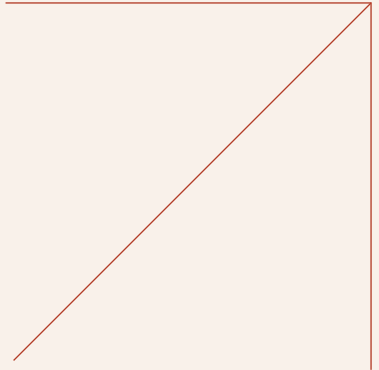
